# GeoFutures 2024: Planetary Geoscience

## What is it?

The Planetary Geoscience Conference is the next conference in the GeoFutures conference series which focuses on the 21st century solutions that geoscientists can offer to global challenges.

The Planetary Geoscience strategic science theme aims to bring together researchers, engineers, policymakers, funders, space agencies and government scientists. The conference will feature contributions from UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) and the Government Office for Science (GO-Science), as well as the UK Planetary Forum (UKPF), the Laboratory Analysis for Research into Extraterrestrial Specimens (LARES) consortium and the UK Cosmochemistry Analysis Network (UKCAN).

Over the course of 2 days, this hybrid conference will cover:

- The Intersection of Missions & Sample Science
- Sample Collection, Curation & Analysis
- Mission Science: Mission highlights, key updates, new mission proposals
- Remote Sensing & Solar System Exploration
- Citizen Science and the Future of Planetary Geoscience
